Friday, December 6th Duvall's Annual Tree Lighting Ceremony



2013 Holiday Ornaments Have Arrived!

The 2013 holiday ornament is here! Featuring an image of the old Duvall library, the ornament is available for purchase on the Duvall Historical Society website (\$10 + shipping and handling), and also at a variety of establishments around town.

The old Duvall library, now Duvall's Visitor and Centennial Center, was built in 1935 on land donated by the city, and constructed by Relief

Administration workers from materials from a demolished building. The small building was said to be a warm and cozy place with a pot bellied stove and a comfortable couch, and 900 books. In the 1920s the Civic Club started a circulating library from donated books and books that they purchased. Even after this library became part of the King County Library System, the Civic Club continued to support the library for all the years of its existence.

As mentioned above, this year's ornament is available for purchase both online, and for \$10 at the following Duvall businesses during the holiday season: Duvall Pharmacy, Cherry Valley Vet, Bank of America, Valley Mailbox, Duvall Bookstore, Quilter's Garden, Duvall Visitor and Centennial Center, Ixtapa, and Country Collections. 

A Blast from the Past

In November 1981, Dolores Schroeder edited the first volume of the Wagon Wheel. A month later she edited volume 1, number 2, and included an article (courtesy of Allen Miller) about "The Big Snow" that hit Duvall during the winter of 1915-1916. That article is reprinted below for your enjoyment, as we barrel into cold weather of our own – do you think Main Street might see this much snow this year, too?



THE BIG SNOW

The winter of 1915-1916 was particularly severe in Cherry Valley; a cold spell developed that lasted for weeks, freezing lakes and ponds to a depth of six inches. Then on the night of Jan. 30th, 1916, a heavy snowstorm arrived that continued until February 2nd. The average depth of the snow was 36 inches and in some places it reached 40 inches. Shown in the photo is the Main street of Duvall looking north.

From the left of the photo can be clearly seen A.H. Boyd's General store, A.P. Manion's Hardware, Brown's Confectionery, Moody's Dry Goods and the Forest Inn. On the right is the Duvall State Bank, Hix's Store, Turner's Tailor Shop, The Duvall Theatre, Dean's Hardware, Martel's Hotel, and the Duvall Pharmacy.
